
Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) is *the* leading known cause of mental retardation in the United States. Studies estimate that approximately 40,000 infants are born with FASD every year. Individuals with FASD are often small at birth, develop slowly, and can suffer from mental retardation or a low IQ. Additionally, they might have learning difficulties, exhibit poor coordination and have problems with memory, attention and judgment.

FASD is completely preventable, however, if a woman abstains from alcohol during pregnancy, making it absolutely imperative that outreach and education are undertaken to address this national concern.


