To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide greater extraterritorial criminal jurisdiction over certain credit card and other access device fraud offenses.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Cybercrime Anti-Re-  
5 sale Deterrent and Extraterritoriality Revision Act of  
6 2015” or the “CARDER Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION.**

2 Subsection (h) of section 1029 of title 18, United  
3 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

4 “(h) Any person who, outside the jurisdiction of the  
5 United States, engages in any act that, if committed with-  
6 in the jurisdiction of the United States, would constitute  
7 an offense under subsection (a) or (b), shall be subject  
8 to the fines, penalties, imprisonment, and forfeiture pro-  
9 vided in this title if the offense involves an access device  
10 issued, owned, managed, or controlled by a financial insti-  
11 tution, account issuer, credit card system member, or  
12 other entity organized under the laws of the United  
13 States, or any State, the District of Columbia, or other  
14 territory of the United States.”.
